

## **Emergency Declaration**

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has declared COVID-19 a “public health emergency of international concern,” and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary has declared that COVID-19 creates a public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Governor’s Office of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania issued a Proclamation of Disaster Emergency on March 6, 2020 due to COVID-19 under the authority of 35 Pa C.S. §7101, et. Seq. that authorized the suspension of certain procedures and formalities prescribed by law and urged local governments in the Commonwealth to “act as necessary to meet the current exigencies,” and

WHEREAS, Section 7501(b) of the Emergency Management Services Code (35 PA CSA §7501) authorizes the Mayor of the Borough of Mayfield, in conjunction with the Council, to declare a local disaster emergency;

NOW THEREFORE I, Alexander J. Chelik, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM and DECLARE a STATE OF EMERGENCY in the BOROUGH of MAYFIELD, LACKAWANNA COUNTY, COMMONWEALTH of PENNSYLVANIA. WHEREAS during the STATE of EMERGENCY, the following restrictions shall be implemented:

Public access to the Mayfield Municipal Building, Emergency Services Center, parks and playgrounds will be restricted beginning March 17, 2020 at 3:00 P.M. until further notice.

Public access to the Mayfield Municipal Building, 739 Penn Avenue, will be restricted. All residents with business relevant to the borough will call the Municipal Building (570) 876-4391, or use Mayfield Borough Facebook.

Public access to the Mayfield Police Department, 500 Lackawanna Avenue, will be restricted until further notice. If you have an emergency and need a police officer, call 911. Otherwise, call the non-emergency number at (570) 342-9111, (570) 876-2540, or (570) 499-1649, or email [mpolicedept@echoes.net](mailto:mpolicedept@echoes.net). Copies of police reports or other police business will be conducted by telephone, cell phone, or email.

Mayfield Borough Real Estate Tax Office will be closed until further notice. Real Estate Taxes are to be mailed to 400 Delaware Street or dropped off at the rear of the office at the same address.


Public access to the Mayfield Borough fire companies and ambulance corps will be restricted until further notice.

If you have an emergency and need the fire departments call 911. Otherwise, call the following non-emergency number (570) 342-9111.

Residents will be updated as necessary using the borough's Mass Notification System, the vocal component to our Whelen Siren, the Mayfield Borough and Mayfield Borough Emergency Management Agency Facebook pages.
